How to support your child with careers?

At George Eliot Academy, we use Unifrog as our main online careers and destinations platform. It helps pupils explore their interests, research career pathways, and record the skills and experiences that will support their future applications. Parents and carers can play a vital role in supporting this process from home.

Below is a step-by-step guide on how you can use Unifrog to help your child plan their next steps.

Logging in

- Pupils can access Unifrog via www.unifrog.org using their school email address.
- They should already have login details — if not, please contact Sophie Smith at Sophie.smith@georgeeliotacademy.org.uk.
- Parents can also create their own login using a special sign-up code provided by the school. This gives you access to the same resources your child sees.

Explore careers and pathways

- Click on the '**Careers Library**' to explore hundreds of job profiles, each with information about salary, skills needed, and routes into the role.
- Use the '**Subjects Library**' to see how school subjects connect to real-world careers.
- Browse the '**Careers Quiz**' to help your child match their interests and strengths to potential jobs.

Research education and training routes

- Use Unifrog to compare college courses, sixth forms, apprenticeships, and university degrees all in one place.
- Each option includes entry requirements, location, and application guidance.
- Pupils can shortlist their favourite courses or apprenticeships to review later.

Build skills and confidence

- Encourage your child to complete the '**Competencies**' section, where they can reflect on skills such as teamwork, leadership, and communication.
- Help them record extracurricular activities, volunteering, or part-time work under '**Activities**' — this information can be used in CVs and applications later.



Support with applications

- When the time comes to apply for post-16 options, Unifrog helps pupils write personal statements, apprenticeship applications, and CVs.
- Parents can review their child's drafts and offer feedback or encouragement.
- The platform also provides tips and guides to help pupils present themselves professionally.

Talk about careers together

- Ask your child to show you what they've been researching on Unifrog — it's a great conversation starter!
- Explore career options together and discuss the skills, qualifications, and pathways they might need.
- Encourage them to keep their profile up to date as they gain new experiences and achievements.

Career Events in School

Year 7 Visit to Coventry University – 1st December 2025

Our Year 7 pupils enjoyed an exciting and inspiring visit to Coventry University, designed to broaden their horizons and support their developing aspirations. Travelling in two groups, pupils took part in a full programme aimed at giving them a taste of university life and helping them imagine the possibilities ahead.

The day began with a warm welcome talk, introducing pupils to the wide range of opportunities that higher education can offer. This set the tone for a day filled with curiosity, discovery, and hands-on learning.

Pupils then explored a variety of subject sessions across different academic fields, including Forensic Investigations, Mechanical Engineering, Mental Health Nursing, Creative Media, and Media. These interactive workshops allowed pupils to experience university-style learning and gain insight into the pathways that could lead to future careers. Many pupils remarked on how exciting it was to try subjects they had never encountered before.



Both groups also enjoyed a guided campus tour, giving them the chance to explore lecture theatres, specialist facilities, and pupil spaces. Seeing a university campus first-hand helped pupils visualise their own potential futures and understand the steps that can take them there.

Throughout the day, pupils demonstrated excellent behaviour and represented the school proudly. Lunchtime provided a welcome break and a chance for pupils to share what they had learned, with many expressing new interest in subjects and careers they had not previously considered.

The visit was a powerful way to bring our STAR value of Ambition to life. By experiencing a real university environment and engaging with future-focused subjects, pupils were encouraged to aim high, believe in their capabilities, and recognise that their dreams can be achieved with determination and effort.

The day ended with pupils returning to school motivated, inspired, and full of exciting ideas about their futures.
