

A message from our Deputy Principal

Our GEA Curriculum Experience

Our aim is to provide an excellent education for all our pupils; an education which brings out the best in all of them and prepares them for success in life. Our curriculum is designed to provide children with the core knowledge they need for success in education and later life, to maximise their cognitive development, to develop the whole person and the talents of the individual and to allow all children to become active and economically self-sufficient citizens.

Our curriculum is based on these key principles:

Entitlement: All pupils have the right to learn what is in the curriculum.

Coherence: Taking the national curriculum as our starting point, the curriculum is sequenced so that powerful knowledge builds term by term and year by year. Connections are made with and between subjects.

Mastery: We ensure that foundation knowledge, skills and concepts are secure before moving on. Pupils regularly revisit prior learning and apply their understanding in new contexts.

Adaptability: The core content, the 'what', of the curriculum is stable, and teachers will adapt lessons – the 'how' – to meet the needs of their own classes.

Representation: All pupils see themselves in the curriculum.

Education with character: Our curriculum is wider than the taught academic subjects. We support pupils' spiritual, moral, social and cultural development and our co-curricular provision and department focus on building cultural capital sees pupils accessing more experiences outside of the classroom.

Alongside our academic curriculum sits our Character and co-curricular offer. We work hard to teach our pupils to be kind and responsible, not because we say so but because it is who we are. Our form time, assemblies and collapsed days will focus on situations and scenarios that make our pupils think and give opportunities in school and beyond to develop key transferable skills that will support them in their next steps.

Our pupils have a say in school and make contributions to the important decisions that support how the school operates. Our departments all give wider opportunities through the trips and house competitions that they run all year round.

It is no wonder our motto is to 'Be Kind and Aim for Excellence',

AI Takes Centre Stage: Engineer Roadshow Inspires Year 7 & 8!

On March 27th, our Year 7 and 8 pupils were treated to a fascinating glimpse into the world of Artificial Intelligence (AI) thanks to an engaging roadshow presented by a team of dynamic engineers. The presentation was packed with interactive demonstrations and insights into the exciting possibilities of AI in various fields.

One of the highlights was undoubtedly the co-bot dog, which captivated pupils with its lifelike movements and capabilities. The engineers also showcased the diverse range of career opportunities available in engineering, emphasising the growing importance of AI in these roles. Pupils were amazed to witness AI being used to generate lyrics, music, and even music videos, highlighting the creative potential of this technology.

The roadshow also featured hands-on demonstrations of prompt engineering, where pupils themselves were guided through the process of instructing AI to perform specific tasks. Another Year 7 pupil added, "It was really fun that pupils and staff could take part in the demonstrations."

The Engineer roadshow was a resounding success, igniting curiosity and inspiring our pupils to explore the exciting possibilities of AI and STEM careers. It was a day of learning, discovery, and fun, leaving a lasting impression on all who attended.




Green Gurus visit Oxford University

"Excellent - well organised, fun, engaging. Fab to do some hands on practical with our son."


"It was interesting to see what my son learns in science. The experiment was enjoyable and fun to do."

Year 9 Entrepreneurs in Action! 💡





