## Attendance percentage equates to the amount of school time missed:

Regular school attendance and punctuality is essential to give your child the best opportunities in life.

Good attendance means a child is less likely to fall behind with their work and more likely to do well in exams.

Research suggests that students who attend school regularly could be less likely to be involved in antisocial behaviour or crime.

There has been a lot of research that proves a direct link between academic achievement and your likely success in your studies. Studies have shown that attendance in all year groups is likely to affect your chances of achieving the government benchmark percentage for 9 - 5 GCSE outcomes in the following ways:





97+% Attendance – Very good chance of achieving the government benchmark percentage for 9 - 5 grades

95% Attendance – Good chance

92% Attendance – Fair chance

90% Attendance - Less than 50% chance

88% Attendance - Less than 35% chance

Under 88% Attendance – Less than 30% chance

Even a few missed days over the school year reduces your child's chances of success!

Excellent punctuality is also key to your child's success. Arriving just 5 minutes late to school each day, equates to 3 days of loss learning over a year.
